
Vision Statement

HCRTA Secretary's Report

Henry County Retired Teachers Association Secretary's Report – November 13, 2017

The Henry County Retired Teachers Association meeting for November was called to order by President Charlotte Shrider. Following recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, President Shrider recognized guests Vicki Gramling, Sue Hurst, Vicki Hesterman and Chuck Klamer. She thanked Carol Agler, Linda Wagner, Diane Meyer and Pam Schwiebert for set-up today and Renee Weaver, Sandy Honemann and Bev Wittes for being the hostess committee. A prayer before the meal was given by Renee, Sandy and Bev. In honor of our guest speakers, the Medicine Girls, tables were dismissed to the meal by means of putting into order various medical procedures by the year when they were first performed. A turkey meal with traditional sides was enjoyed by all.

After the meal, President Shrider introduced the speakers, the Medicine Girls. These two sisters, Jeanne Caryer and Susan Wiesehan, took us on a journey into the past, with a look at the history of medicine, home cures and medical care received by early settlers in the Black Swamp. Far removed from the methods of medicine we see today, these early settlers relied mainly on the mother of the household for most treatments of illness or accidents. These women in turn relied on home remedies handed down from generation to generation. Medicine shows hawked various "cures" for any ailment. Doctors were not well trained and the ingredients in many medicines then routinely prescribed we now know were toxic or addictive.

The ladies had many examples of vintage medicine bottles and other memorabilia on display. It was a very interesting look back at what those early settlers endured in order to settle the Great Black Swamp.

The business meeting was then called to order. The secretary and treasurer's reports were approved as presented in the newsletter.

SCAMS TARGETING OHIOANS

Be aware that scams are an ever-present aspect of our society these days and learn how to avoid being taken by people out to rob you of your savings. The Ohio Attorney General has an excellent brochure you can use to educate and protect yourself and loved ones. Here are some of the types of scams to watch out for.

- Computer Repair Scam
- Fake Check Scam
- Imposter Scam
- Grandparent Scam
- Phishing and Spoofing Scam
- Romance Scam
- Sweepstakes Scam
- Home Improvement Scam
- Phony Charity Scam

TIPS for AVOIDING SCAMS

ALWAYS:

- Be skeptical when someone requests immediate payment via wire-transfer, prepaid money card, or gift card.
- Look into businesses through the Ohio Attorney General's Office and the Better Business Bureau.
- Beware of strangers who seek new, quick, personal connections with you or a loved one.
- · Research charities through the Ohio Attorney General's Office.
- Keep your personal information private and shred documents containing such information.

NEVER:

- Send money via wire-transfer, prepaid money card, or gift card to a stranger.
- Give personal information to someone who has contacted you unexpectedly.
- Carry unnecessary personal information, such as your Social Security card or Medicare card, in your wallet or purse.
- · Pay to win a prize or sweepstakes.
- Allow someone "remote access" to your computer.
- · Pay the full amount upfront before any work has been done.
