Henry County Retired Teachers Association Secretary's Report March 12, 2018

The Henry County Retired Teachers Association meeting for March was called to order by Vice President Karen Maassel. Following recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, guests were acknowledged and the hostess and set up volunteers were thanked. In honor of March being Oscar month, tables were dismissed to the buffet by putting into order Oscar nominees by their number of nominations. An Irish blessing and prayer was offered by Bev Wittes, then all enjoyed lunch, including cookies festively frosted for St. Patrick's Day.

Following lunch, Pam Thompson spoke briefly about the CASA program. This program trains volunteers to be advocates for children as their families deal with issues through the court system. CASA volunteers receive about 30 hours of training and spend many hours talking to people in the child's life, helping the court determine the best interests of that child. The ultimate goal is a safe home for every child. Advocates continue to have contact with the children for at least two years and many continue on for long after that. Abbie Badenhop also spoke briefly about the S.T.A.R. Mentoring program, which works to pair at-risk youth that come into the court system with a positive adult role model. Both ladies urged those interested in helping youth and their families to consider volunteering for these important programs.

The business meeting was called to order. The Secretary and Treasurer's reports were approved as printed.

<u>Courtesy:</u> Sandy Honemann and Marlene Jones reported sending greeting cards and get-well cards to several members. Condolences were sent to Dick Baldwin on the passing of his wife Shirley.

Legislative: Becky Schindler discussed the current move to institute "Right to Work" laws in Ohio and the effect that would have on teachers and other

union groups. She urged members to contact their legislators about this issue.

<u>Membership</u>: Nan Bretz reminded all that this is the time of year when active teachers are considering retirement and we should actively seek those who may be interested in joining HCRTA. Contact her with names of potential members.

<u>Community Service</u>: Tom Jenny had as usual placed volunteer hour tally sheets at each table. Be sure to record all of your volunteer hours each meeting, as retired teachers contribute in many ways to our communities.
