Henry County Retired Teachers Association Secretary's Report – November 12, 2018

The Henry County Retired Teachers Association meeting for November was called to order by President Charlotte Shrider. She welcomed guests Kelly Valentine and Sue Hurst. Famous persons with birthdays on November 12th helped to determine the order of tables dismissed to the meal. Sandy Honemann offered the prayer, which included a tribute to Larry Sasaki, who passed away recently and will be greatly missed by so many. A delicious turkey dinner with many traditional sides was enjoyed by all.

Following the meal, President Shrider opened the meeting. The Secretary and Treasurer's reports were approved as printed.

Concern was expressed for several members: Sue Meyer is to begin receiving chemo soon; Ruth Johnson received her stem cell infusion and is doing well so far; expressions of sympathy were sent to Bonnie Sasaki at her husband Larry's passing and to Betsy Redd, whose husband also passed away the same week. Committee Reports:

Legislative: Becky Schindler spoke on health care and the open enrollment period. Members expressed concern about potential problems with ProMedica, as they have sent notices indicating they will no longer accept Aetna insurance.

Dictionary Project: Chairman Gene Grime reported that all the dictionaries have been delivered to the third-grade students and thank you notes from them have begun to arrive. He may have some to share at the December meeting.

Education Foundation: Copies of proposed changes to the by-laws were available on the tables before the meeting. President of the Foundation Linda Wagner called for a motion to accept the proposed

Old Business:

President Charlotte reported on her attendance at the ORTA meeting in Findlay.
