Update From ORTA

Below is some information from Executive Director that was in the last newsletter.

<u>STRS</u> - The meeting of the STRS Board of Trustees was held on October 17, 2019. A large group of retirees from OEA r270 (Cleveland) was present and several of these retirees spoke to the STRS Board and reminded them that the loss of COLA has been devastating to their lifestyle in retirement. As usual, I also offered comments on behalf of the ORTA members. My comments are included in this newsletter.

What I think is an important point to make is that I have noticed a 'change' in the attitude of the Board of Trustees. It seems to me that the messages of retirees are making an impact on the board. Some evidence of this change includes:

- Lowering from 100% to 85% the funding level required for benefit enhancement to retirees. This change in policy at STRS is significant. Consider that the STRS Pension System has NEVER been at a 100% funding level. Under the older policy it is likely that STRS beneficiaries would not see any increase in benefits until 2034 or after! 85% is still a significant hurdle to cross, however, 85% is much more realistic than 100%.
- At the meeting on the 17th there was some discussion of increasing the employer contribution rate. Ohio's employer contribution rate to STRS has been 14% for several decades. By way of comparison, Ohio's employer rate of contribution is one of the lowest in the country. It was reported that other state's contribution rates are much higher than Ohio's. This is the first time I have heard such discussion at STRS.
