You may recall that ORTA hired a company to do a Forensic Audit of the finances and management at STRS.

The Forensic Audit of STRS has been published and is dynamite. We could have had our COLA for years except for (1) the incompetence of the elected board members or their lack of interest in doing their oversight job, (2) the lack of transparency of the STRS management team in providing information required by state and federal law, (3) the failure to implement the 2006 state mandated audit changes, and (4) sweetheart relationships between STRS staff and the actual fund management companies. BILLIONS have been squandered and lost over the years.

## **LifeWise Academy**

At our May meeting we heard about the LifeWise Academy which is getting started in our area for children attending local schools. LifeWise Academy is a **Released Time Religious Instruction** program. It is a division of Stand for Truth, a nonprofit Christian ministry with the vision to reach unchurched public-school students with the Gospel. Under RTRI laws, students can be released from public school during the school day to attend religious classes, provided the program is: 1) off school property, 2) privately funded, and 3) parent permitted. Studies show 8 in 10 American youth do not attend church. This is an opportunity to reach these children in our community. The curriculum is Bible-based, character-focused and focused on the central messages of the Bible. The finer points of religious doctrine are avoided. The curriculum is focused on the most foundational themes that speak to the issues common to all people. Holgate, Liberty Center, Napoleon, and Defiance are planning on having LifeWise Academy this fall.
