The Henry County Retired Teachers Association meeting for July was called to order by President Charlotte Shrider. Following the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer, President Charlotte recognized the hostess (her) and the set up volunteers Greg and Duane for the evening. The tables were dismissed by what condiment was on the hot dog on the table centerpiece.

Following the meal, Terri Witt announced the 2021 Book Grant Foundation Winners. Allyssa Jackson and Callie Seedorf received the Griffith Family Book Grant. STRS AUDIT – COLA AND YOU

You may recall that ORTA hired a company to do a Forensic Audit of the finances and management at STRS.

The Forensic Audit of STRS has been published and is dynamite. FACTS: We could have had our COLA for years except for these facts.

<u>POOR OVERSIGHT</u> - elected board members lack of interest in doing their oversight job.

<u>TRANSPARENCY</u> - the STRS management team has not provided information required by state and federal law.

<u>2006 MANDATED CHANGES</u> – The state mandated audit changes which STRS still has not done. companies.

BILLIONS have been squandered and lost over the years through use of "alternate investments" in private companies. In 2017 STRS lost \$525 million when Panda (a company in Texas STRS invested in) filed for bankruptcy in April 2017. This was not revealed until 2020. Meanwhile STRS continued to pay over ½ million \$\$\$ to the Panda Power Fund in 2018 and 2019. Why?

STRS is STILL refusing to provide the following to the auditors that ORTA hired: (1) purchase price of these 135 "alternate investments", (2) current value of these investments, and (3) fees being paid related to the maintenance of these investments. ORTA has a court case filed seeking to force release of this information.


