STRS FACTS

ACCORDING TO THE <u>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR</u> <u>OF STRS:</u>

13.8 BILLION WOULD BE THE COST OF COLA FOR EIGHTEEN YEARS, the average life expectancy of a STRS RETIREE.

PROJECTED EARNINGS FOR STRS is PROJECTED AT SEVEN PERCENT A YEAR

STRS CURRENT ASSET VALUE IS APPROXIMATELY **100 BILLION**. 7% times 100 billion EQUALS SEVEN BILLION <u>EARNINGS</u> PER YEAR.

TOTAL EARNINGS FOR EIGHTEEN YEARS IS 126 BILLION!

SUBTRACT COLA of 14 BILLION AND (126B -14B = 112B) STRS WOULD STILL HAVE 112 BILLION

Deficit amount for yearly Retiree Payments is 4 BILLION (4B X 18yrs = 72B) ...= Amt paid out for 18 years

(112 B-72 B =40 B) ...40 Billion excess after paying COLA and DEFICIT

STRS would EARN ENOUGH TO PAY COLA and COVER PAYMENTS TO RETIREES AND STILL HAVE 40 BILLION LEFTOVER.
