If you have not yet heard, all three candidates backed by ORTA and the reform groups were elected to the STRS Board. They take office September 1<sup>st</sup>.



So, the "reform" members of the board will be Rudy

Fichtenbaum, Wade Steen, Elizabeth Jones, Steven Foreman and Julie Sellers.

HOWEVER, if you have been following the actions of the STRS Board since the election, it would appear that there is little interest in addressing the issues that caused active and retired teachers to overwhelmingly reject the sitting board members efforts to be re-elected. In fact, even in light of this and the sharp drop in the stock market, there have been no apparent efforts to rethink their approach. At the June board meeting they voted raises for staff, increases in bonuses, and a 27<sup>th</sup> paycheck for employees.

We will need to stay active with ORTA and the main reform groups (STRS Members Only FB group and STRS Ohio Watchdogs FB group). It may be necessary for us to organize for NEXT May's election to push for more reform candidates. FINALLY, if you are not yet an ORTA member, please join. That is the best way to keep informed.

# **Agape Missions Worldwide**

At our May meeting our speakers were Tahir & Fouzia Masood, and HCRTA member Steve Seagrave. The Agape Missions Worldwide charitable foundation was established and registered in January 2017. They are a newly formed, small, grass-roots charitable foundation based in Liberty Center, Ohio.

The nonprofit began as a local church effort to help a Christian family from Pakistan who had come to America seeking asylum. (Members of Liberty Chapel UMC brought the Masood family to meet with members of the church in early 2016.) In their home country they were actively involved in supporting and extending outreach to their Christian community and had become concerned for the safety of their family. They operate a nonprofit in Faisalabad, Pakistan for the support of several Christian communities.

Currently Agape Missions Worldwide is working to provide basic health care, primary education,

and Sunday Schools for orphaned and needy children in culturally Christian communities in Pakistan. Orphaned and needy children, families and individuals in this community go without proper food, education, shelter and essential medical care every day due to a variety of factors including low wages, job loss, injuries, illness, age, domestic violence, or discrimination. The only way they are allowed education or services is if they convert to Islam and give up their faith.
